Swimming gold medallist Adam Peaty opens showpiece leisure centre

Rio Olympics hero admits: 'I was scared of water

as a child'

OLYMPIC swimming hero Adam Peaty opened the £9m state-of-the-art Holly Hill Leisure Centre and admitted:

"Although it might be hard to believe, I was actually scared of water when I was younger."

Adam, who triumphed at the Rio Olympics by winning Team GB's first gold medal in the 100m breaststroke breaking his world record set the day before, was acutely afraid of being bathed as a young boy.

The 21-year-old super star was full of praise for the showpiece centre in Sarisbury which boasts a 25-me- It's not often you get a swimming lesson from an Olympic champion. tre pool with 6 lanes and a learner pool, gym, spinning room and dance centre.

In a landmark day for the Western Wards, he told guests: "I know how important it is that we educate more people about the health and safety benefits of swimming, especially those who live in coastal areas such as Fareham.

"I think the pool here at Holly Hill Leisure Centre will go a long way in helping to do that.

"It's also at local pools like these where future athletes are discovered and, for me, it's very exciting to think that could happen here at Holly Hill."

A plague was unveiled at the centre by Adam and the Mayor of Fareham, Councillor Connie Hockley.

Fareham Council Leader Seán Woodward said: "This is the

delivery of my longest standing pledge. made over 25 years ago, and I am so grateful to all





those who made it possible.

"It is the culmination of a project which began after our suggestion, strongly supported by residents, that we needed

another swimming pool in the Borough."

Over 2,000 people have signed up for membership and the centre is open to all.

Fareham's Conservative-run Council has also provided new sports pitches near the leisure centre, worked with volunteers to improve the woodland and lake and has also agreed a £130,000 multi-use games area which will be provided in the new year.

The Council periodically has to produce an updated Local Plan, identifying areas accepted for residential building and areas designated as countryside.

Developers have recently submitted plans for housing on some of the countryside designated areas.

The current Local Plan is only two years old and in theory such applications should be refused by the Planning Committee.

However, residents should remain aware of any proposals, raise objections and notify your local Councillors Brian Bayford and Simon Martin at the earliest opportunity.

You may make objections to the Council and if necessary make a formal deputation to the Planning Committee.

Park Gate police are 'passionate about the job'



COUNCILLORS visited Park Gate police station to learn how their wards are policed.

Park Gate policing team comprises a sergeant, 6

PCSOs and 4 police officers.

After the visit, Councillor Brian Bayford said: "The male and female staff are passionate about their role. professional in their work and look to protect the vulnerable in our community.

"They are involved daily in the general roles of reducing crime, catching criminals and reducing threat, risk and harm in our community.

"The team are very personable and have a wealth of experience in the geography of the area, some officers having patrolled these streets and dealt with the community for over 10 years.

"Over that time policing has changed remarkably. with response and patrol teams moving from Park Gate to Fareham Reach on the A32, officers being issued with body worn video new procedures and

processes designed to improve and speed up their work load.

"Like any industry some work better than others, but Sergeant Nick Morgan's team have learnt to adjust to the changes.

"The team tries to engage with the community as much as possible with beat surgeries in Stubbington, Locks Heath and Titchfield.

"They regularly visit youth clubs and youth groups to engage and build relationships with children that are an investment for their future behaviour.

"They have to find the balance between their roles, resources and the public's expectations. At times they will not meet those expectations, but they try their best and are passionate about the role they signed up for. "

Travellers evicted by police after defying Council legal order to quit Lockswood site



TRAVELLERS angered residents by invading the open space by the car wash at Lockswood Centre on July 28, leaving heaps of rubbish before police evicted them.

Councillor Brian Bayford received numerous complaints and next day the travellers were told by officers they were trespassing on Council land and ordered to leave immediately.

Later that day, officers returned to the site and gave each occupant a letter from the Council's solicitors instructing them to leave immediately, otherwise court proceedings would be taken to remove them.

But they ignored the threat, so on August 1, after Council officers discovered numerous piles of rubbish and fly tipping, the police, who had visited the site daily, attended again and decided to use their S61 powers to remove the travellers from the site.

The police served notice on the travellers to leave by 2pm and by 2.30 all had left the site, leaving Council taxpayers to foot the bill for cleaning up their mess.
