One of the exciting projects I have supported from my Hampshire County Council grants is a recently launched



local charity by Stephen Bond called PALS Society for people with alternative learning styles (pictured).

More is needed to recognise autism, dyspraxia and learning difficulties and I am pleased to support the efforts that PALS Society is making to provide equal opportunities for employment for these young people.

PALS Work Placements will deliver training for young people to enable

them, should they so choose, to enter a social firm delivering IT products and services.

They will learn technical skills, customer skills and the ability to work together as a team, whilst developing a portfolio of achievements that they can take to prospective employers.

PALS Society meets every Saturday afternoon at the Crofton Youth Project (building in front of the Stubbington Community Centre) to upskill young people.

FAREHAM'S TRANSPORT

We have worked with the highways authority and Highways England to bring forward over £500 million of roads investment:

Stubbington Bypass, Newgate Lane North and South, St Margaret's Roundabout, Peel Common Roundabout and A27 dual carriageway from Segensworth to Fareham



Smart Motorway programme to add extra lanes to the M27 and M3 with variable speed limits and major improvements to Junctions 9 and 10

FAREHAM'S FINANCES

We froze the Council Tax for 7 years and have recently increased it by just a penny a day. That is our pledge for the future

We invest in commercial property, mainly in Fareham, which brings benefits in terms of keeping council tax low and preserving excellent services

We only raise 14% of spending from Council Tax, so we are very careful with your money which is why we continue to set almost the lowest district council tax in England while providing some of the best services



FAREHAM'S ENVIRONMENT

We have pledged to ban the use of single-use plastics by the Council as soon as possible

We will work with the police to see zero tolerance of pavement parking which is both anti-social and dangerous

We aim to introduce a recycling scheme for pots, tubs and trays for Fareham residents until it can be provided across Hampshire
