# Volunteers make the most of Warsash Common

Over many years, a group of hard working residents have been working diligently to develop and enhance our wonderful Warsash Common. In January, Councillors Trevor Cartwright and Mike Ford visited the Common to meet and thank the volunteers and find out about the work they had recently undertaken.

In 2018, the group:

- Constructed a 'hibernacula' a winter home for slow worms.
- Held a sell out event for families at Easter to discuss the Common's Owl population
- Undertook a summer reptile survey that discovered a good population of reptiles, including a Great Crested Newt - an endangered species not seen at this location in over 12 years
- Created a remembrance memorial, with two strips of red poppies flanking a strip of white. This reminder of the Armistice will provide a lovely show of colour between May and June this year.

In addition the final stretch of the gravel pathway around Dibles Meadow has been laid along with a new woodland pasture.

Trevor and Mike, along with those many folk who enjoy the Common, have been hugely impressed with the work carried out by the Fareham Conservation Volunteers under the direction of the Council's Countryside Ranger Mark. Our thanks go out to this superb and dedicated team.

## **Keeping Council** Tax down - again

With a further loss of central government financial support Fareham Borough Council has increased its share of Council Tax by just £5 per year representing just a penny a day increase for the average (band C) property in Fareham. A band D property in Fareham will be paying £160 per year or just 44p per day for all of Fareham Borough Council's services.

Out of some £47m spent annually by the Borough Council less that £7m is raised via Council Tax. This means that 85% of council spending is not raised from Council tax but rather from the council's other trading activities. This includes a portfolio of mainly local commercial property which raises millions of pounds in rental income per year. For example most of the units at Southampton Road, Park Gate (B&Q, Dunelm, Halfords, Home Bargains, PC World, etc) belong to the council. Without this income our council tax, currently almost the lowest in the country, would need to be far higher.

at Solent Airport@Daedalus where around £30m has so far been spent on infrastructure and new commercial buildings such as the newly extended having only been open for a matter The airport operation is now starting to provide a financial return to the council while seeing flight movements increased to 30,000 annually and hundreds of new jobs created on what is the Solent Enterprise Zone.

The target over the 25 year life of the Enterprise Zone for new jobs is 3,500 within 1,100 of those being on the Fareham part of the site. Already over half of the total has been reached in the first few years. Fuel sales alone at the airport are booming thanks in part to Spitfires based at the site having been flying regularly through much of last year. Fareham Borough Council has also transferred land to Fareham College for the building of a Civil Engineering Training Centre (CETC) to teach young people the skills they need to undertake civil engineering works in this area where there is a huge skills shortage.

Improvements that the council is looking to make in the future include a capital programme of £39m:

Ferneham Hall refurbishment £10m

- Spec build business units at Solent Airport@Daedalus £5m plus other investment
- New council housing in Fareham, Portchester, Stubbington and Sarisbury £17.6m
- Phasing out the use of single-use plastics by the council ASAP
- Play area improvements £500,000
- Bus shelter replacement £300,000

  Hally Hill Correctors and a reliable.
- Holly Hill Cemetery extension £275,000

Councillor Seán Woodward, Leader of the Council, said "The pressures to set a balanced budget without reducing services become more challenging with every year that passes. We have plans for another £1m of annual savings found via e ciencies rather than service reductions."

# Hampshire to get more Police Officers

Cllr Cartwright, as a member of the Hampshire Police and Crime Panel, reports that, at the meeting in January 2019, the Police Crime Commissioner's recommendation to increase the Council Tax Precept by £24.00 per year for Band D properties was unanimously supported by the Panel. This was on the understanding that by doing so, all the additional money raised would protect local policing which would see the appointment of 200 new Police O cers, 65 Police Sta Investigators, and training for a new cadre of PCSOs.

Cllr Cartwright welcomed the proposed additions to the Police numbers and felt that local residents would be very pleased to see additional O cers on the streets enabling neighbourhood policing to be strengthened.

# **University floats plans for Maritime Institute**

Councillors Trevor Cartwright and Mike Ford attended a recent briefing meeting where Professor Graham Baldwin, Vice-Chancellor of Solent University explained their proposals for the Warsash campus.

A £26m investment is planned for the lower (river side) site that will include a Safety Training Centre featuring a live fire training ground with an innovative smoke filtration system and a state of the art survival pool.


It is anticipated that the enabling works contract and the main planning application will be awarded between

March and September 2019 with a main contract being awarded shortly afterwards.

On the upper, now surplus site, the University's indicative design shows there may be 64 new build homes, 30 conversions and a 46 bed care home within the listed buildings. The potential time line for this site sees a

contract exchange with the selected developer in March 2019, a scheme design and Planning Application in early 2020 with the sale being completed in April 2020.

Trevor was particularly pleased to hear that their intention is to continue to support the Warsash Sea Cadets.



# Solar bin trialled in Warsash

The eagle-eyed amongst you may have noticed a futuristic looking bin in the Passage Lane car park. This Smart bin is being trialled in Warsash to see if they can help to reduce littering in the Borough.

This is one of two Solar powered bins that have been placed at two popular locations, Holly Hill play area and Passage Lane.

The Smart bins can take up to ten times more volume, as the waste gets crushed and compacted several times a day. With batteries which allow the bin to operate for 13 weeks without a



light source, the bin is able to email the council when full. The units are sealed to stop birds and vermin getting in and can only be opened using a foot pedal.

The Council will also be trialling an alternative version at the same locations between March 2019 and August 2019.

Councillors Mike Ford and Seán Woodward recently joined members of the Warsash Tennis Club at their Open Day. The Councillors were delighted to see the club's excellent new courts, which both Fareham Borough and Hampshire County Councils provided grants for, with Mike, Trevor and Seán supporting the club and their application.

Helen Rawlins from the Club said, "We would like to thank FBC and HCC for their grants in helping the club resurface our worn out courts and are excited to unveil our new Wimbledon coloured courts. We are a small village tennis club with four floodlit courts so can play all year round. We have players, young, old, and everyone inbetween and welcome non-members to come and play on our courts."
