UPDATE Haven House at Titchfield Nature Reserve

We are delighted to report that, following Fareham Borough Council's decision to protect Haven House at Titchfield Haven National Nature Reserve from sale by Hampshire County Council for at least 6 months, work is moving ahead at pace with Hampshire and Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust and Hill Head Residents' Association to arrive at options and a business plan to present to the County Council with the intention of potentially taking over the nature reserve and Haven House.



Haven House had 85,000 visitors annually prior

to its unnecessary closure by the County Council.

Borough Council Leader Seán Woodward is calling for the County Council to hand over Haven House, Haven Cottage and the nature reserve at no cost to be run by the local community. - £25 million for building new council houses and upgrading existing stock.
- Plans to demolish the 50-year-old Osborn Road multi-storey car park and replace it with a modern surface car park, electric car charging points and solar panels to generate power.
- Air-ground lighting at Solent Airport to attract and keep more aviation tenants.
- A £1 million children's playground refurbishment programme across Fareham.
- Over £3 million of disabled adaptation grants to help people make adaptations to their homes.
- A £400,000 programme of works to improve community centres.
