Our local electoral boundaries are changing...



Two sets of boundary changes are altering the electoral map of Fareham in 2024.

Boundaries reviews are completed periodically to ensure constituencies and wards are of similar size and will be altered to reflect the rising and falling population; the current Parliamentary boundaries were designed in 2000 and the Borough in 2002.

The first change relates to the Parliamentary boundary which will divide the area, with the western wards forming part of 'Hamble Valley', while the central wards along with Portchester will join Demand to become 'Fareham and Waterlooville'.

The second change relates to Fareham Council wards. From May 2024 onwards, roads south of The Avenue (A27) will be included in the new 'Avenue' ward, and Titchfield ward will gain the roads between Warasah Road and Hunts Pond Road, Lynn Crescent and Bedford Drive, previously Titchfield Common ward. Fareham Council will be reviewing polling station locations this year in preparation.

Huge £30m investment to

regenerate the **Town Centre!**

Fareham Borough Council is taking another big step forward in centre has much to its plans to breathe new life into Fareham Town Centre through a comprehensive programme of investment and regeneration.

The new community, arts and entertainment venue, Fareham Live, with a total of around 1,000 seats, is already set to become a hugely important asset for the town with new modern parking alongside, and the Council is now considering the acquisition of a series of other assets, one of which is Fareham Shopping Centre.

Town centres across the country have been affected by the collapse of the department store sector, shifts in customers' shopping habits, and many high street brands either moving online or disappearing altogether.



While Fareham town offer residents and visitors, with many national outlets and independent traders along with food and entertainment, it has been

affected by national trends.

The Council wants to ensure that the town centre responds effectively and takes the opportunity to re-invent itself by offering a wide range of uses alongside vibrant and wellconnected public spaces in order to ensure its success in the long term.

The Council has recently decided to take the bold step of setting aside over £30m of funding to support a significant regeneration programme.

Major investments are currently being made with the development of Fareham Live and the forthcoming demolition of the decaying Osborn Road multi-storey car park in favour of a new surface car park. The Council is now in active discussions with the owners regarding the possible acquisition of a series of town centre properties including Fareham Shopping Centre.

Work will be undertaken over the coming months to create a draft Regeneration Framework for public consultation and partner engagement.



Conservative Councillors are seizing the opportunity to regenerate our Town Centre!

Councillor Seán Woodward, Executive Leader of the Council, said: "We are committed to the longterm regeneration of Fareham town centre and have been making plans over several years for how this may be achieved. People now look to town centres to provide a broader mix of leisure and social activities, as well as retail outlets offering products and services that are not so available online, together with opportunities for town centre living.

"We need to acknowledge that the private sector alone will not bring forward the regeneration of Fareham town centre. The Council will be leading on harnessing the resources of both the public and private sector to help deliver effective regeneration over the coming years.

"This injection of over £30m of funding is just the start of ensuring that the town centre delivers what the residents of Fareham need for the future. Looking ahead we will be taking the important step of seeking early views from all parts of the local community on the regeneration opportunities that lie ahead."
