#### **Anger at Fishers Hill Closure Decision**

Many residents are angry at **Hampshire County Council's** decision to close Fishers Hill to through traffic.

A barrier will be installed mid-way along, turning the road into two long cul-de-sacs.

The County Council carried out a

consultation in 2020, and a further one this year. On both occasions local residents opposed the closure overwhelmingly in their responses. But they were ignored. Why? Unfortunately, our area's Independent County Councillor Sarah Pankhurst supported the closure. It's time we had a local County Councillor who listens to local people.

Our local Councillor Tina Ellis organised a deputation to the County Council to present residents' views. Our other local Councillor Roger Bird joined Tina in the deputation and commented: "It is wrong for the County Council to ignore the clear majority of respondents. For a consultation to be meaningful and democratic, Councillors and officers need to listen and respond accordingly. This isn't over."

# An update from Suella Braverman KC MP

In addition, the government is simplifying tax for 2 million self-employed, and I am delighted this will benefit Fareham's entrepreneurs. With £11 million a year removed from business taxes, *this is the biggest tax cut in modern British history!* 

## Fareham Community Hospital: New Renal Unit

I was delighted to join the official opening of the new Dialysis Unit at Fareham Community Hospital. Thank you to the team at QA who have worked to open this new multi-million pound health care facility, supported by my Taskforce which I have chaired for several years.

The new 25 bed renal dialysis unit will provide life saving treatment to 150 patients a week, helping with chronic kidney disease who would otherwise have to travel make miles for intravenous iron infusions, outpatient care and dialysis. We estimate that this new service will save over 300,000 miles of travel and make treatment more available to thousands of patients.

This is the latest in improvements that we have seen in recent years at Fareham Community Hospital. My Taskforce has been working with health partners to facilitate greater usage of this fantastic Hospital and I'm glad that we've seen a new Chemotherapy unit, Vaccination centre and Same Day Access to a GP at FCH over the last few years.

#### **Empty Homes! Continued...**

Our local Councillors Tina Ellis and Roger Bird are keeping up their campaign to reduce the eyesore of empty homes.

In July 2023 Fareham Council adopted an Empty Homes Policy. It's designed to focus attention and resources on bringing empty homes back into use.

Each property has its own special history and requires a considered response. The policy acts as the council's toolkit to determine the best approach in each case.

This is a great opportunity to bring much-needed homes into use. Each rejuvenated home also improves the street scene, reduces the environmental risk of pests and reduces the need for new building on greenfield sites. Our campaign is directed at long term eyesores. We will never take away a home in which someone is living, nor would we ever take the home of an elderly person in care.

#### **Dangerous Wall: Peak Lane**

Councillor Tina Ellis has had enquiries from residents about the reduced height wall seen at Peak Lane. The assumption the Council own all the green space and boundaries is far from true, in this particular case the walled boundary to this green space enjoyed by residents does not belong to either the Borough or County Council.

With the wall becoming an increasing cause for concern due to it's instability, it is clear action was required. Fareham Borough Council have now stepped in with the appropriate permissions for a 'dangerous structure' to bring the wall to a stable height, strengthening buttress pillars can be seen meaning the area remains safe for play, without being completely open to the main road.

#### **Majestic Oak Tree Works!**

Our local Councillor Tina Ellis reports:

Keeping with Peak Lane, some work was recently done on the majestic oak, however, we are concerned in places where the paving has become restricted due to the sheer size and heave from large trees such as this. The same applies to restricted paving where properties have left shrubs and trees to encroach making travel with a mobility scooters, wheelchairs or pushchairs difficult.

Please have a look and see if your area has problems giving consideration to those with limited sight too.

Overhanging branches and overgrowth cannot be detected, particularly in these darker nights. Now is the time to get any cut back of hedging planned well in advance of nesting season when it is an offence to disturb nesting birds.

#### Fareham Council Executive Member Ian Bastable writes:

We all want an easy to use waste collection service, and many people would like to be able to recycle a greater range of items; in particular, plastic tubs and trays which today cannot be recycled in Hampshire.

Part of planned government reforms are to have a unified recycling service across the country. As Fareham's Executive Member for Streetscene, I have been working with the government minister Rebecca Pow (see photo)

to agree a satisfactory way forward for the residents of Fareham that does not require seven separate bins. This has resulted in recent announcements by the Prime Minister.

Fareham's food waste is currently converted to energy, minimising the environmental impact. I am now insisting that a separate food waste collection service will only be implemented if it brings a net environmental benefit.

I am also working hard to simplify the remainder of the recycling collection service.

In the same area is sadly one of the worst potholes and deteriorated road surfaces in Fareham West! Tina has reported this on a number of occasions as it has been marked up for repair for quite some time. It is hoped by time you read this, the Highway Authority will have responded to her numerous requests.
