#### **ACTION - not words: Brook Lane Road Safety**

Local Park Gate Councillors Ian Bastable and Simon Martin have worked over a number of years with County Councillor Seán Woodward and Hampshire Highways officers to deliver safety improvements on Brook Lane, especially in the vicinity of Brookfield School.

So far, they have been successful in obtaining road markings, signage, safety railings and parking restrictions. They are now leading the campaign to get new controlled pedestrian crossings to aid children's safe routes to and from the local schools.

Councillor Seán Woodward was successful achieving the crossing on Lockswood Road however despite the traffic/pedestrian surveys he had carried out on Brook Lane, the results of which certainly justify a crossing south of the Brook Lane/Headland Drive roundabout, finding a suitable location has, due to restricted pavement width and the visibility issues for traffic coming up Lockswood Road and turning left into Brook Lane, so far proved impossible. But he won't give up!

Now, Ian and Simon are working with Seán to look into the possibility of acquiring land adjacent to the footway near to the school for use as a controlled crossing.

This would have the benefit of being as close as possible to the desired line that the children want to use, or else it will simply not be used. This is why they cannot north of the roundabout.

Additionally, our local Councillors have also persuaded Council Officers to investigate the feasibility of controlled crossings both near Fareham Community Hospital and at the top of Brook Lane, adjacent to Bridge Road/A27.

# **Botley Road:** Tackling an eyesore!

Fareham Council continues to pursue the owner of the old Threshers building on Botley Road at Park Gate through the courts having served a Section 215 Notice on the owner, Mr Gill, for both the severe dilapidation of the building and grounds.

As none of the works required by the Notice had been carried out, the next step was to prosecute. Initially the site owner was summonsed to appear before Portsmouth Magistrates Court, for failing to comply with the Notice.

At the hearing the Magistrates found the site owner guilty of the offence and imposed a fine of £1,000 plus a surcharge. Any further prosecution can include a fine of up to £1,000 plus a fine of up to £100 per day, for every day the Notice has remained not complied.

In November, the Judge imposed a sentence comprising a fine of £8,400 and required Mr Gill to pay the Council's costs on top of this.

Councillor Ian Bastable said: "This absolute eyesore issue has remained unresolved for years despite the Council taking all the legal action available to it. We will not give up and will do whatever it takes to deal with this unacceptable situation."

We all want an easy to use waste collection service, and many people would like to be able to recycle a greater range of items; in particular, plastic tubs and trays which today cannot be recycled in Hampshire.

Part of planned government reforms are to have a unified recycling service across the country. As Fareham's Executive Member for Streetscene, I have been working with the government minister Rebecca Pow (see photo)

to agree a satisfactory way forward for the residents of Fareham that does not require seven separate bins. This has resulted in recent announcements by the Prime Minister.

Fareham's food waste is currently converted to energy, minimising the environmental impact. I am now insisting that a separate food waste collection service will only be implemented if it brings a net environmental benefit.

I am also working hard to simplify the remainder of the recycling collection service.

### Locks Heath Centre: Anti-Social Behaviour

Local Locks Heath Councillors Susan Bayford and Malcolm Daniells, alongside local residents, are concerned about the increasing anti-social behaviour at the Skate Park area close to the Locks Heath Centre.

Following a spate of incidents where glass was taken from the bottle bank and strewn on the grass and play areas, Councillor Susan Bayford asked the Council to erect a fence to fill a gap in the hedge in an effort to deter behaviour of this nature.

There have also been a number of fires started in the woods and recreation area. Whilst in the area last month, Susan had a call from the shopping centre manager and rushed over to the Teen Shelter where fire officers were damping down several logs that had been set alight.

Your local Conservative Councillors would like to see a CCTV camera installed at the recreation area but the Police do need to build up a case file on the number of anti-social incidents taking place.

To achieve this, we ask that local residents who do witness such incidents inform the Police as soon as possible by dialling 101 or go to hampshire.police.uk and search for 'Contact Us'.
