# 'End this hospital red tape scandal' says Louise

## £24m lavished on NHS showpiece that operates office hours and 5-day week

DEMANDS are mounting for an end to NHS red tape which is stifling expansion of much needed services at Fareham Community Hospital.

The £24m showpiece has been open just over 5 years, but is tangled in a web of officialdom.

Fareham North Conservative candidate Louise Clubley says: "It's a scandal. How can a hospital cater for the community if it only opens Mondays to Fridays for 45 hours a week?"

Medical bosses say the building is totally under-used and there's nobody in overall control.

Ironically, it is the NHS that insists the hospital must be fully used before it can be developed to completion.

**InTouch** revealed recently that extra services proposed by the NHS Property Services Agency would have to rent space at commercial rates.

**Louise Clubley** said: "This is why the Red Cross medical loans store has not been used for the last 5 years due to the excessive rent demanded.

"Thankfully, this has now been resolved and Fareham & Gosport CCG will pay the rent. I am pleased to announce that the loan store was opened in March."

The CCG plans full use of the hospital by contracting out more outpatient clinics and it wants a minor injuries unit and other diagnostic facilities to provide a wider

range of services closer to the community.

It also plans to provide further services at the hospital and a day care centre for dementia sufferers.

She added: "I will support my colleagues and our MP to ensure that the hospital operates in the interests of residents, that we continue to progress in making essential

services available and that our hospital is fully developed for you to use.

"I want to see effective management in place of bureaucracy and service delivery to respond to need and reduce waiting lists."

Fareham MP Suella Fernandes persuaded Health Minister Jeremy Hunt to visit the hospital.

He stated: "It was extremely useful to sit down with the key people in the local health economy.

"They have some really exciting ideas to deliver better care at Fareham Community Hospital and to properly join up health and social care.

"I look forward to helping where I can and have asked to be kept updated on progress through Suella Fer-

nandes."

Suella said: "We can do more with Fareham Community Hospital and so I set up Fareham Community Hospital Taskforce to provide leadership and clear strategy on making better use for all.

"I am sure local campaigners like **Louise Clubley** will contribute to a brighter future for the hospital."

### A top class recreation hub

LOUISE is proud of efforts made by the Conservative Council to give residents of Fareham North top class facilities at the Leisure Centre and Park Lane Recreation Ground.

After the £2m refurbishment of the Leisure Centre and swimming pools in 2014, user numbers continue to rise and the range of exercise groups has brought many people together to form friendships.

The parkland is equally popular, especially with dog walkers, with others taking advantage of the outdoor gym equipment as they admire the selection of new species of trees and planting of shrubs in the area designated as an arboretum.

Popular also are the improved children's play area with its grassed enclosure, giving families a safe picnic spot in fine weather, and the new skate park designed by young residents, who show their remarkable talent on the ramps.

Louise said: "As a great supporter of giving young-

sters activities during the summer holidays, I'm delighted the 'Access all areas' summer play scheme will continue this year, when the park will be used for the first and last days of the event."

From noon on Tuesday, July 26, young people can register on site before enjoying activities in the park and Leisure Centre; on the final day, Thursday, August 18, an added attraction will be a fun fair with free rides until the close at 6pm.

More seating is planned around the park this year, with extra car parking on the site of the disused tennis courts. A multi-use artificial sports pitch is planned, but this is not within this year's budget.
