Methods of voting

Voters may cast their votes in a number of different ways

If you are away or cannot go to the polling station on **Thursday 5th May** you can do one of the following:

■ Apply to vote by **Post**. You do not need a reason to vote by post. Your postal vote can be sent to any address you provide. The deadline for completed applications is **5pm** on Tuesday **19th April 2016**. If you are given a postal vote, you will not be able to vote in person at this election, but you may take your vote to a Polling Station.

OR

■ Apply to vote by **Proxy** (this means that someone else can vote on your behalf). You need to provide a reason to appoint a proxy. The deadline for completed applications is **5pm** on Tuesday **26th April 2016**. If you appoint a proxy, you can vote if you wish, but only if your proxy has not already voted on your behalf, and does not have a postal vote for you.

OR

■ You can vote **Personally** at the polling station on Election Day.

To find out how to apply for a postal or proxy vote, or if you have a medical emergency after **5pm** on Tuesday **26th April 2016** please phone the helpline **01329 824588**. Owing to the fact that this leaflet has been delivered by hand some of the dates above may have already passed.
