Trevor Alford: We'll fight an appeal'



FAREHAM planners unanimously rejected the latest bid to plunder the green fields at Cranleigh Road.

It was the **Conservative**-run administration's response to a barrage of objections by local residents.

Portchester East **Conservative** candidate **Trevor Alford**, who is pictured with the open space developers are itching to get their hands on, said he fully supported the decision.

"If elected on May 5, I will represent residents' views on this planning application at any future appeal."

Persimmon Homes have tried unsuccessfully for the past decade to bulldoze the land for housing.

Their latest attempt was an outline application for 120 houses.

Trevor Alford said developers appealed in 2006, but planning committee chairman and Conservative Councillor Nick Walker (Portchester West) made



such a good case that the inspector dismissed it.
A recent survey in Hatherley Crescent and the surrounding roads showed 99% of residents objected to houses being built in our countryside.

Trevor Alford said: "The reasons for objection were increased traffic leading to rat-running through Hatherley Crescent and into Beaulieu Avenue, more strain on doctors' surgeries and schools, protection of our countryside and disturbance of the natural habitat which has grown over the years.

"I will always fight to protect our areas of countryside at Cranleigh Road but there are other areas we must protect at Romsey Avenue and Winnham Farm which could be potentially under threat in the future."

The Council is waiting to see whether the developers will lodge another appeal.

CHARLENE WORSFOLD'S petition was on the agenda of the meeting of a planning review panel recently.

Traders fear the Lidl superstore will have a knock-on effect on the shopping precinct.
